Broke Hill Golf Club – Update

The new Sevenoaks Local Plan is currently undergoing an examination by a Government Inspector. To recap, the Council decided not to include Broke Hill as a major housing site, but to leave it as open Green Belt land. The Resident's Association has written to the Inspector in support of the Council's position. In the meantime, Quinn Estates, who own the

site, have submitted an outline planning application for a predominantly residential development on the land. The application seeks an 'in

principle' permission for up to 850 dwellings, a retirement living village, a primary school hub, rugby and hockey pitches with separate car park and clubhouse areas, two hectares of commercial use, a local centre with commercial retail and commercial facilities, undercroft car parking for Knockholt Station, open space including landscaping, infrastructure and groundworks. Only means of access are to be determined at the stage and the application shows two vehicular accesses on to Sevenoaks Road.

The application can be viewed on Sevenoaks Council's website under reference 19/02616/OUT. The applicants also have their own website promoting the proposals – www.stonehouse-park.com

The Residents Association has decided to object to the planning application, primarily on the grounds of loss of open Green Belt land, loss of habitat, impact of additional traffic and the impact on local facilities such as schools, GPs, hospitals, social services etc. It is not known when the application will be determined by Sevenoaks Council and the future of Broke Hill still remains uncertain; the Residents Association will continue to provide updates on progress.
